Last year I purchased a book titled, "300 Writing Prompts," thinking that it might be interesting to use it for a journal article now and then. So, I opened it to a random page and found this question: What keeps you from getting a good night's sleep? ...Okay, bad idea. But as I continued trying to think of a suitable topic, the words just kept resurfacing in my mind. Maybe this stray, disheartening query is the most relevant thing we could possibly ask ourselves right about now.

micron. That's what keeps me up at night. Not that I have it. Or do I? None of us really knows until we've been tested! That, in itself, is causing restless nights worldwide. The ramifications are affecting all things everywhere at this point. As much as we all wish that we wouldn't be talking about COVID anymore, if you're like me you hope that this latest frenzy of somewhat less serious infections is the harbinger of more sustainably normal days to come. Such hope provides me a countermeasure against the sleep I lose every day out of concern for each one of you, wanting to protect you the best way that I can from this ugly virus. Yes, we want to—and we need to be—together in community. But the fundamental responsibilities of disciples and stewards are to love our neighbor and to do no harm, both of which make our decisions so difficult each and every week.

Victory is mentioned upwards of 93 times in our Scriptures, yet it seems so elusive right now when the only "v" word we seem to hear is *viral*, whether that's in social media or literally in the air. Not surprising that might you lose sleep wondering if, and when, as 1 Corinthians notes, God will truly give us the victory through Christ! Here's the thing: the world needs for us to be rested. The world needs the collective spiritual strength of all people of all faiths to come together and work together and *help* together. But how will you get rest in the midst of all this?

Ecclesiology is the study of how the church advances its mission in the world. It comes from the word *ecclesia*, which means "those called out." You <u>are</u> the ones called... to carry out that very mission! Central to that is: the constant drive to re-center ourselves in Christ; to refocus on God; and to place ourselves at God's disposal. Translation: Let God guide you, let God embrace you, let God handle the heavy lifting. The peace that passes all understanding isn't in elimination of conflict or disease, but in the recognition that God is still in charge—even in the middle of the chaos. My personal go-to text for days like this is Psalm 4:8: *At day's end I am ready for sound sleep; because you, O Lord, have put my life back together*. (The Message). So: get rest, you! God has this. Your only job... is to love!



DEACON'S CORNER

As we look forward to Lent we have to remember what it is that we look for. Lent is a time when we can reflect on our life from the previous year and think of the things that we have done, good and bad. The good that we do is pleasing to God as we carry out the things that further God's mission in this world. As they say, God's work our hands. You see, we are the workers in the field, spreading the love of God to our neighbors and friends. In the process of doing this, we some times get sidetracked in our own world and lose sight of what God wants us to do. That's our free will kicking in. Now is the season when we can look back on these times and see if we can repent and move forward with the love of God. Lent is the season where we can ask God to forgive us our indiscretions and loss of direction, and get back on that track of doing what God wants us to do. We will spend 40 days doing this, looking forward to Easter where we can start anew and ask forgiveness from our God for all the things that we did that were not pleasing to Him.

We can do this by attending the services that are being held right here at St John's. Starting with Maundy Thursday service Thursday 7:30 PM in the Nave, where we strip the Nave in preparation of the coming days leading up to Easter. Good Friday has two services, the first at noon where we have veneration of the Cross. We will nail all our sins on pieces of paper to the large cross that is in the Nave. Those will be burned and go up in smoke and disappear as God has told us. The second Good Friday service is at 7:30 PM, when we will have the Tenebrea service with readings and hymns telling the story of the death of Jesus and the closing of the door to the tomb. All of this leads to Easter Sunday, the day when we finally come together to rejoice in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus, the culmination of our three days of sorrow. The light shines! Jesus has risen and is alive, and we can rejoice in this miracle. We are rejuvenated once again to go out into the world and tell the story to all those who will listen that Jesus Christ has risen and is alive. Amen.

Directing Lay Ministries, NOT Velveteen Rabbits!

It happens to everyone, you pick up the phone and are asked to volunteer for something for which you have no ability or interest in, something you do not feel called to do. That's how I ended up being a director for a local Children's Theater Production, *The Velveteen Rabbit*. The guy who asked me to direct was desperate for a leader and put the pressure on big time to fill the spot. I did NOT feel equipped, nor called to do this job, and I said, "yes" only out of obligation/pressure put upon me. I counted the days and could not wait for it to be over.

I guess it wasn't all bad, because that experience continues to give me perspective in my job as DLM



(Director of Lay Ministry). Part of my job is to help people connect through volunteering, but I have never wanted to put pressure on people to do things just to fill jobs at church. (That is how a person might end up directing a Children's Theater play and hating every minute of it!) I want to help people develop their God-given gifts and help them discern where they are feeling called to serve. Our church "agendas" or "spots that need to be filled" should not be driving that bus; the Holy Spirit needs to be at the wheel! We need to be willing passengers, ready to jump into action, even if the road He is taking us on is unfamiliar. My hope is that parishioners pray and listen to where the Holy Spirit leads when it comes to volunteerism at church, then be willing to go where they are sent. Even if the call might stretch comfort zones, people can find new purpose and deeper connections with God and others when the Holy Spirit drives.

One practical way this can happen, is to have volunteer opportunities suggested to individuals, you know, opportunities that don't just fill spots, but opportunities that are *meaningful* to a person. YOU know YOU best, so that is why I find the Time and Talent Sheets people fill out so incredibly helpful to use when I think of people for volunteer

opportunities in my job as DLM. T & T sheets are filled out by individuals, and they check areas of interest (perhaps also areas they may feel gifted.) People are NOT signing up to volunteer when the form is handed in, they are simply filling out a form that I can use as a tool to help match people and volunteer opportunities better. I am certainly not the Holy Spirit, and prayer before committing is important when one is evaluating a service opportunity. However, these forms are a tool I use to help present these opportunities and they can be extremely useful in the matching process.

If you have *never* filled out a Time and Talent form, if you desire to find more meaningful ways to connect at St. John's or if you have not filled out a T & T form in a while and you would like to update some of the areas of interest, I ask you to please consider doing so within the next few weeks. (There is no deadline, but procrastination is never a friend!) If you are getting this Journal electronically, a copy is attached to the email. 
She also produced 2 sample videos featuring the 9:00 AM Contemporary Service and the 10:30 AM Traditional Service.
