


### **MUSIC**

road while in the car, the bag could be offered to the person.








JAM Kids Sign the Benediction

#### **Bible Studies**

Bible Studies were offered during Lent and Advent at the church. Lutheranism 101, Sacred Pathways and Lesson Discussion formats were used.
